Last week began with a ceremony at the Town Council Meeting in honor of **Charlotte Petrick's** outstanding performance in winning the Canadian Under 14 Championship. Charlotte was greeted warmly before the meeting by Parks & Recreation Director Clive Buist and by Councillor Martin Mazza (chair of the Parks & Recreation Committee), then was presented with a plaque by Lord Mayor David Eke as part of the official proceedings.

A reception followed at the tennis pavilion, with a nice turnout of members taking the opportunity to get to know Charlotte better and to wish her well in her summer competition schedule. This week, she's in Bermuda at an ITF U18 tournament, and will compete in the Ontario U18 Championships (starting June 27) and the Canadian U18 Championships (starting August 7).

They have guided Charlotte's progress and indulged her endless enthusiasm for the game. It was clearly Charlotte's greatest pleasure to have her three brothers - Joshua, David and Nicholas - on hand to share the Monday evening festivities.

Laura had a 1-win,1-loss record after the first day so it was time to find a hotel near York University and prepare for the next round.
