Town to resurface tennis courts

The Town has plans to resurface the Rye Heritage tennis courts by the of the summer.

The courts in St. Davids Lions Park and the Garrison Village Green also need resurfacing, a parks and recreation request says, but will have

to wait until future years.

Clive Buist, the director of parks and recreation, is asking council for approval to spend almost \$70,000 on the Rye Heritage courts, in the most need of repair of the three locations, and to put money away in future budgets for work at the other two courts.

The parks and recreation committee approved the request Monday, which will go to council

next week.

The 2013 parks and recreation capital budget has \$70,000 budgeted to cover all three courts being topped with asphalt, but a closer look indicated drainage issues at Rye Heritage and Garrison Village, and problems with tree roots at the St. Davids Lions Park.

Accordingly Buist is recommending all three sites have asphalt

removed and replaced, and new fencing around an enlarged surface area to improve maintenance and increase the life of the courts by another 30 years or more.

The courts at Memorial Park also need to be resurfaced, and will be expanded as well, with funds already budgeted and with the hope of good news in the way of a Trillium grant to help pay for the work.
