

Thanks once again to Richard Berti, our two new "rain shuttles" now have hooks attached to the handles so that they can be hung neatly on the fence and out of way when playing tennis.

We Need Your Help

Thanks for taking a moment when visiting the courts to tidy up. It only takes a moment to pick up an empty tin left behind or a water bottle forgotten to be discarded. There is white garbage beside the door for this purpose.

The Town does not provide on-court maintenance so it is up to each of us to pitch in to keep the courts looking tidy. Thanks for taking a moment to help out.



Members have commented that the court door has been left open when the courts are unattended on several occasions. The Club has invested in new tennis accessories such as benches, court drying equipment, First Aid Box and score markers.

A First Aid Kit has already "walked off" and has had to be replaced by the Club. We think having a First Aid kit on the courts is a useful benefit for our members, but we need your help in protecting our equipment so that it is available, if you need it.

Did You Know?

- Forgot your tennis balls or yours are getting a little "tired". Balls are available for purchase in the Pavilion Kitchen for \$4/ tin. Group Co-ordinators have keys to the kitchen.
- Cold ice packs are also in the kitchen freezer if needed.
 Please be sure to replace it after use so that it is there for the next Club Member that might need it.
- Reminder that a "defibulator" is now available in the Swimming Pool facility with trained staff on duty during pool hours.
- As noted on signs in the Pavilion and on the Tennis Courts Gate, we welcome guests to use our courts



Since we like our courts to look neat and tidy, Ross suggests that we take the time to return the equipment to either the volleyball or soccer field side of the courts.

Two sets of court drying equipment (rain shuttles & rollers) have been purchased, so that one set can be stored at each side of the courts, for Club Member convenience.

during Open Court time for a fee of **\$10 per person** with a maximum charge of **\$20 per court**.

- Guest Fees can be deposited in the white deposit box located on the courts by the light switch. or Visitors can be directed to the Crabtree & Evelyn store on Queen Street to purchase a Bag Tag with instructions on how to access the courts.
- We have purchased two different types of court drying tools. The Rain Shuttle is a wide blade on wheels, for easy use, and is great for quickly moving excess water from the court to drain off the court edge. The rollers are used to then help pick up and spread any other water on the courts. Once this is done, we have found that with typical warm weather conditions, the sun and wind will then dry the courts in 15 - 20 minutes.
