## **NOTL Outdoor Winter Tennis 2023**

Outdoor winter tennis will again be available this year at the Rye Courts, Garrison Court and, new this year, the St. David's Courts. The Town has agreed to leave the posts up as well as the nets. The only thing players need to do is crank the nets up to play and then crank them down when finished to take the pressure off the posts.

Below is the suggested process to follow:

1. The crank for the nets is in the kitchen at the clubhouse. A 2nd crank is with Keith Stuart and he can be reached at 905-353-5360. Please pick one up and return it after playing. Note: Another suggestion is that you can use a 9/16" or 15mm socket with a socket wrench and keep it in your tennis bag and you will have your own crank.

2. Put the crank on the nut on the tennis posts and crank up the net. It is easier to crank if one person lifts the net in the centre while the other person cranks the net up.
3. After playing, please make sure to lower the nets down to the original level.
4. Return the crank or put the socket wrench in your tennis bag.

It's important to understand that you are playing at your own risk and the Town will not have any liability if there is an accident.

We would like to thank Dan Maksenuk from the Town's Parks & Recreation Department for his assistance in making the public courts available for play over the winter.
