

An Eco Friendly Solution for "Dead" Tennis Balls

Tired of having cans of dead tennis balls cluttering your closet or tennis bag? Hate throwing balls and cans into the garbage?

Thanks to Carol MacSween's leadership, we are excited to announce a **tennis ball recycling** initiative so dead tennis balls will live on in other forms as rubber, fabric, plastic bin liners, ink and t-shirts. Every part of the tennis ball, plastic sleeve and lid is being recycled as part of an innovative program.

HOW TO DO YOUR PART - It's EASY! You will notice a black bin by the two court gates with a RECYCLE logo. When your balls are considered "dead", please deposit them in these bins instead of the garbage bins on the court. Balls, ball sleeves, plastic lids and metal tags -- it all goes in the recycle bin. Carol will be looking for a few volunteers to empty the bins on the court every few days. Please reach out to her if you would like to volunteer a few hours in the season to help keep tennis balls out of landfill.

CLUB NIGHT balls will continue to be deposited in the CLUB NIGHT ball drop in the pavilion. These Club Balls are reused in our Ball Machine and for Round Robin play before they will make their way to the recycling program.
